Elizabeth Altman, aided by Luiz Mendes and Helen Heinrich, gave a presentation explaining the university's Institutional Repository (IR) / eCommons project. This project will capture, organize, digitize, preserve and make available online campus intellectual and administrative output. The project, proposed by the CSU Council of Library Directors (COLD), will allow each CSU campus to establish an online institutional repository of their output. The project is in its beginning phase. Q&A followed about who would give permission to use a work and what kinds of access rights would there be. These are yet to be determined.
