- A. H. Hertzog (Chair) announced that the Ad Hoc General Education Committee has been formed and that Vicki Pedone is the Chair.
- B. H. Hertzog announced that next EPC meeting will be held on May 6 in UN 215. It was rescheduled from May 13, 2009.
- C. H. Hertzog announced that there were no objections to Withdrawals Policy as reviewed by the Faculty Senate. It will be up for a second reading on April 20, 2009.
- D. H. Hertzog announced that data on hybrid courses will be gathered as part of a survey conducted by IR and that data will be available in Fall 2009.
- E. C. Rawitch announced that limited summer 2009 course offerings may adversely affect graduating seniors. In cases in which students are not able to graduate due to the reduced summer course offerings, the University will attempt to accommodate students using GE and major substitutions or waivers as appropriate using the established petition process.

It was **MSP** to revise the following:

This new counting of maximum repeats for grade forgiveness and grade averaging starts anew in Fall 2009. Any repeats used prior to the start of the Fall 2009 semester will not be counted in these new maximums.

This new counting of maximum repeats begins in Fall 2009. Repeats for grade forgiveness accumulated prior to the start of the Fall 2009 semester will be carried forward and will be counted toward the maximum 16 units. The counting of repeats for grade averaging—now limited to a maximum of 12—will begin at zero in Fall 2009 for all students.
