- **H.** D. Schwartz presented a draft policy on Limiting Majors and/or Minors. [See Attachment IIH]. The following issue were discussed at the table:
 - Clarification of item V and of an appeal process for students slightly over the total unit limit
 - Whether students or Admissions and Records will perform calculations mentioned in item VIII
 - Concern for transfer students admitted with many units

EPC <u>did not vote</u> on this policy. This policy will be revised and reviewed again on December 9, 2009.

I. The Hybrid Course Discussion did not take place because of time. This will be on the agenda for December 9, 2009.

Draft for EPC Discussion

- I. <u>Declaring a major</u>: Students who start at CSUN as freshmen must declare a major by completion of 60 earned units. Transfer students must declare a major in their transfer application. Students who have earned 60 units and have not declared a major (and all transfer students) will have hard computer holds placed on their ability to register for the following semester's courses. These students will not be able to register for courses until they declare a major. Note: Developmental units do not count in the 60 units. Advanced Placement (high school) units do count in the 60 units.
- II. Second major: Students seeking an additional major must declare the second major by 90 units. Students may not add a second major after completing requirements for their first major. Students can double major only if they can complete both majors within 140 units. (Exceptions can be made for CSUN bachelor's degrees that require more than 120 units to complete.) Students who receive an exemption must be able to complete the second major within 20 units beyond the number of units required for a bachelor's degree in their first major.
- III. <u>Changing major</u>: Students seeking to change majors must be able to complete the new major within 140 units. Students may not change majors after completing 75% of their current major's requirements.
- IV. <u>Adding minors</u>: Students may add up to two minors by 90 units as long as they can be completed within a total of 140 units.
- V. Student requests for change of major, adding a major or minor, or change of minor will not be automatically approved for students who have earned 90 or more units. Such requests must be approved by the associate dean of the college of the new/additional major/minor. Requests must be accompanied by a plan demonstrating that the new/additional major or minor can be completed within a total of 140 units.
- VI. A maximum of up to two majors and up to two minors is permitted, provided all work can be completed within 140 units.
- VII. When computing the unit earned limits on majors and minors, only 70 community college transfer units and 90 four-year college/community college combination transfer units will be counted.
- VIII. A student who has accumulated over 140 earned units will be graduated administratively if s/he has earned any major, whether or not the student has declared that major. Even if the student has not declared a major, enrollment will be restricted to courses required to graduate in the major for which the student has accomplished the highest percentage of requirements.
- IX. <u>Appeals process</u>: Students who wish to appeal this policy or a related decision can apply to a University appeals board composed of associate deans and a representative of Undergraduate Studies.
- X. Students who cannot complete their current major because of an inability to complete/pass a requirement may file a request with the University appeals board to change majors even though they have exceeded the stated limits. If this appeal is granted, the student will need to develop and follow a completion plan for the new major. Or, If this appeal is granted, the student must complete the new major within a total of 140 units.
