I. Announcements

L. Becker welcomed new EPC member L. Borchard; members, associate deans and guests introduced themselves.

L. Becker explained that provisionally approved curricula are brought to EPC as information items only (not voted on). E. Adams added that departments have free rein to offer selected topics in an approved sequence; however, EPC needs to make sure that departments are not using selected topics to bypass regular curriculum processes. If a certain topic is offered regularly, then it needs to be proposed as a regular course. Both E. Adams and L. Becker recommended that the committee look at revising the Standard Operating Procedures or creating a policy addressing how many times a selected topic should be offered.
