# Mary Wahl led a focus group discussion on behalf of the Library's Strategic Planning Task Force.

- Questions were posed and feedback was gathered from the group related to their positive experiences and interactions with the Oviatt Library.
  - o In general there was praise for the support offered by librarians, the Teacher Curriculum Center, Interlibrary Loan services, classroom presentations, Special Collections and Archives, access to e-journals, Music and Media, the partnership with the NCOD, and access to Web of Science among other things.
- A second question was posed related to areas that could use improvement.

 Some suggestions were made, including: the TCC should be promoted and more visible, the IT help desk information is not always reliable, more outreach and support for graduate students, and extend reserve book time limits.

A questionnaire was circulated to assess committee interest in various topics for possible presentations at future meetings.
