ULMS circulation and fine policies with Mike Villalobos

- The ULMS team is proposing the elimination of overdue fines for main collections at all campus libraries, which COLD will vote on.
- Some studies suggest that fines may not be an effective deterrent.
- The inequity between the fines policies for faculty and students was highlighted.
- The goal of the updated policy proposal is to simplify the user experience across campus.
- Some points in the new policy include: the elimination of fines for the main collection, increasing the student loan period to a semester with a predetermined end-of-semester due date and no late fees, and replacement bills will go to the Bursar's Office.
- There will continue to be recalls.
- This would not apply to reserve or CMS items, or fees charged by ILL. We are currently examining our methods for encouraging timely return of reserve items, which may or may not involve changing our fines policy.
- Suspension of library privileges does not affect access to electronic resources.

- Any changes in policy that affect the faculty will likely be cleared through the Faculty Senate.
