#### **New Business**

# Guest Presentation: Streaming Media in the Library – Lindsay Brown

- A detailed review of CSUN's streaming video resources found at https://libguides.csun.edu/streaming-video.
- CSUN stopped supporting VHS technology five years ago, although 40 titles remain based on faculty/curriculum needs.
- CSUN's Kanopy online streaming currently offers 253 titles with a playlist option.
   Campus Quality Funding allows more selections to be added.
- Kanopy may also be searched via OneSearch. If faculty can't find a title, the online Video Request Form may be used, which applies to both physical DVDs and streaming.
- CSU+ sourced DVDs may be accessed through the Oviatt's Interlibrary Loan (ILL) department.
- The L.A. Public Library <a href="www.lapl.org">www.lapl.org</a> provides a wide array of free streaming and learning resources for California residents, including 27,000+ Kanopy titles, Freegal (music downloads), eBooks, and Mango (language learning). Up to five titles a month can be viewed with a current library card (eCards are available).
- Limitations of the CSUN collection include the case of a Netflix series not yet released on DVD or some items that are not available for purchase.
- A request was made to include more resources on the engineering topic.
