Summary of Activities

Throughout 2017-18, Dean Stover provided the FSLC with updates about the Library's strategic plan, current initiatives, grant awards, special exhibitions and events, and renovation plans. As in the past years, Dean Stover gave an overview of the Library's budget and projected funding. In addition and in consultation with the Chair, he arranged a series of guest presentations by Library staff on a range of topics, based on Committee members' preferences. For a complete list of presentations, see below.

- **September 6, 2017 meeting:**
 - General announcements included that the AS Farmer's Market will be returning in the fall, Tuesday's from 10:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. Videos shown by faculty in their courses must be captioned, and faculty may contact the NCOD for assistance with this process. The new Interim Dean of the Michael D. Eisner College of Education- Shari Tarver Behring.
 - The Dean's report outlined upcoming projects and events, such as the "She Started It" film screening, Student Legal Support Clinic, Banned Books Readout, the Jack Kirby exhibit, and the 9th Annual Research Fellows Colloquium.
 - The revised "Gift Book Policy" was distributed to the group. The Oviatt Library has revised its acceptance of library materials due to space, resource constraints, and increasing availability of electronic resources.
 - The proposed timeline for the removal of the people counter/security gates is winter 2018.
- **October 4, 2017 meeting:**
 - General announcements included the concert performance by TEMPO in the Cypress Recital Hall on October 8th and the Getty Initiative beginning on October 14th with "Judith F. Baca's Experimentations in Collaboration and Concrete" exhibit, curated by CSUN art history professor Mario Ontiveros and highlighting Baca's "The Great Wall of Los Angeles."
 - Upcoming projects and events for October and November were outlined in the Dean's Report to include National Media Literacy Week; GIS Day (Geographic Information System Day); Dana Gioia, CA Poet Laureate: The Joys of Prose and Poetry; and Data Jam – a series of workshops will be held every Friday in October to present students with methodology and technology needed to interpret and manipulate data.
 - Dean Stover also reported on the development of a campus Makerspace at the Oviatt Library, which aims to encourage collaborative interactions amongst small groups of students through embodied learning, involving hands-on activities that enable students to connect the body and mind. A taskforce was appointed by the Provost and the grand opening has been projected for Fall 2018.
- **November 1, 2017 meeting:**
 - The Dean's report included announcements regarding several upcoming events: Media Literacy Week, November 6-10, 2017, including a screening/live tweet of *The Illusionists* documentary on November 7, 2017 from 11:00a.m.-12:30p.m.; GIS Day (Geographic Information System Day) on November 15, 2017, 10:00a.m.-3:00p.m. with a free pizza lunch. The event coincides with the map library relocation to the Oviatt; The Joys of Poetry and Prose by Dana Gioia, CA Poet Laureate, November 16, 2017, 4:00p.m.-6:00p.m., Bob and Maureen Gohstand Leisure Reading Room with (3) 20 minute sessions: 1) The benefits of reading prose for pleasure, 2) poetry recital and 3) Q&A;

- Open Access Week recognition delayed by 1 month vs. last year. Open Science and the Future of Research and Education, November 29, 2017 from 8:30a.m.-12:30p.m. The Oviatt Library's Open Access Award recipient is Dr. Steven Oppenheimer.
- A faculty member reported difficulty with off-campus search functionality. FSLC members discussed their experiences with OneSearch, such as resources not showing up in search results and the lack of intuitiveness. A guest speaker/librarian will be sourced to highlight new search systems and technology.
 - **February 7, 2018 meeting:**
 - General announcements included clarification of upcoming meeting dates and a reminder about the Associated Students' Farmer's Market held every Tuesday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. A Campus Dining cooking demonstration is held there once a month with free food samples. Faculty was asked to spread the word to students, as a higher attendance rate will encourage farmers to continue participating.
 - New business included notice that library enhancements currently in progress involve moving of the Teacher Curriculum Center (TCC) to the 2nd floor, partnering with Music and Media (M&M) and moving of the Map Collection to the Garden Level of the Oviatt. Renovations will take place in the summer with an expected completion by fall semester 2018. The Library is open until 8:00 p.m. on Fridays as a result of student demand, and the Library noise policy is under review based on the online user survey still in progress.

Guest Speakers/Presentations

- At the September meeting, there was a tour of the newly expanded Special Collections and Archives at the Oviatt led by Ellen Jarosz.
- At the October meeting, Isis Leininger presented on 3D Printers in the Creative Media Studio, which provides a space for student audio/visual design and production and access to free 3D printing services, audio recording studio, and seven-day device checkout funded by the Campus Quality Fee. Kathy Dabbour also discussed that Campus IT Classroom Support will no longer be able to support the UVN beginning next Spring Semester 2018 or possibly earlier due to classroom computers being updated from Windows 7 to 10.
- At the November meeting, a presentation was given by Coleen Martin, Outreach Services Librarian - Oviatt Library Outreach Programming and Local Schools, “Why the Need for Oviatt Library Outreach with LAUSD?” Statistics indicate the need for library resource support in LAUSD schools. The Oviatt currently works with 29 Valley area “feeder” schools and also offers an AP Program, with the largest user groups include Granada Hills Charter High School and Northridge Academy High School. Current outreach instruction with feeder schools includes library lectures, Oviatt tours and book borrowing. FSLC members were to receive a copy of Coleen’s presentation to share with faculty.
- At the February meeting, Lindsay Brown presented on “Streaming Media in the Library.” A detailed review of CSUN’s streaming video resources can be found at <https://libguides.csun.edu/streaming-video>. CSUN stopped supporting VHS technology five years ago, although 40 titles remain based on faculty/curriculum needs. CSUN’s Kanopy online streaming currently offers 253 titles with a playlist option and may be searched via OneSearch. Campus Quality Funding allows more selections to be added. If faculty can’t find a title, the online Video Request Form may be used, which applies to both physical DVDs and streaming. CSU+ sourced DVDs may be accessed through the Oviatt’s Interlibrary Loan (ILL) department.
- There were no guest speakers/presentations at the March meeting.
- At the April meeting, Jamie Johnson gave a presentation entitled, “The New Unified Library Discovery System: OneSearch.” OneSearch was recently upgraded and the system is now improved. Basic functionality was demonstrated and a OneSearch Tip Sheet was distributed to meeting attendees and PDF copy issued via email to FSLC members following the meeting.
