 Journals publishing directly to OA


Green Road to OA

 - ScholarWorks CSUN's Institutional Repository
 - arXiv, (Cornell U.) etc. subject repositories




Why Open Access?

- Rising costs (compared to CPI)
- Shrinking funding = shrinking access

How is CSUN impacted?


- Priced out of accessing CSUN journals!
 - Dept. of Geography:
 - The California Geographer (an EBSCO Premier title, out of our price range)
- Declining access impacts:
 - SLOs
 - Faculty productivity & research

How does OA help faculty?

- "Open Access Citation Advantage" (OACA)
 - Selected Studies from 2001 2009 (69% 480%)
 - Lawrence (2001): OACA= 157%
 - Brody (2004): OACA= 80-200%
 - Harnad, Brody (2004): OACA= 150-480%
 - Piwowar, Day, Fridsma (2007) OACA= 69%
 - Gentil-Beccot, Mele, Brooks (2009) OACA= 400%
 - Wagner (2010) Open access citation advantage: An annotated bibliography http://www.istl.org/10-2inter/article2.html

Downloads & Citations

Open Access increases citations



Range = 36%-200%

How CSUN Faculty can participate

- Publish in a Gold OA Journal
- Post work openly on website [at a risk]
- Submit work to a Green OA Repository
 - ScholarWorks
 - Via Scholar Spotlight
 - Self-submissions, too

** **NO DIFFERENCE** IN OACA BETWEEN GOLD OR **GREEN** OA models! (Gargouri, et. al, 2010)

How do Institutional Repositories help?

- Provide open access content via Green OA model
- Digital Preservation Services:
 - Permanent urls
 - Digital backups
 - Long-term funding model & support
- Improve overall findability: Google &c.
- Contribute to global information sharing
- Showcase CSUN-related scholarship; improve its reputation on national/international scale

FOR INSTRUCTION AND RESEARCH

- **1,500** OA items
- 700+ CSUN/Admin & Department pubs (newsletters, CSUN public documents, PR, etc.)
- 375 electronic theses & dissertations (Mandated by CSUN May 2012)







UCSF's Faculty OA Mandate:

 UCSF Academic Senate voted on and unanimously passed an Open Access Policy for UCSF faculty at its May 21, 2012 Division Meeting

4 Main Elements:

- 1) Deposit: Faculty submit article to repository / notify if already OA or in another OA repository
- 2) Embargo: Faculty notify that a publication cannot be displayed until publisher's embargo period has expired (6-12 months often)
- 3) Addendum: Faculty notify publishers of their rights under the campus OA policy by generating an addendum to attach to publisher's author agreement.
- 4) Opt-out Waiver: Faculty can request a waiver to optout of the Open Access license for a single publication

Toward OA Mandates at CSUN

- Building consensus bottom-up & top-down
- Coordination with peer institutions strength in numbers (UC model)
- Copyright: The Elephant in the Room; but easier w/ institutional support
- Allow for exemptions & flexible frameworks
- Library plays a large service role
 - (Scholar Spotlight, for example)
